Corinda Ladies, who recently won their third First Division pennant, have an impressive record in this competition.

The standard of bowls was excellent and the wide margin of the win was not an indication of the play.

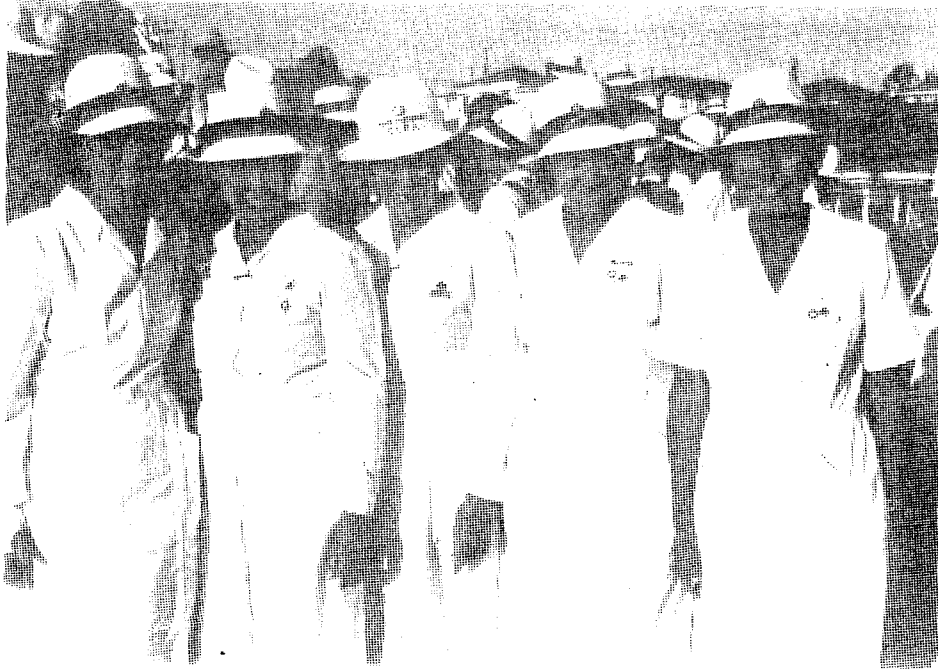
